
How to download your family from FamilySearch to Legacy

To prepare Legacy to integrate with FamilySearch Family Tree




- 1. Start *Legacy*. It will usually start up with the last file upon which you worked. In fact you can read that file name beside the title word "Legacy" at the very top of your program. (See 1. File name here)
- 2. Next determine if you have the *FamilySearch* options turned on in your existing *Legacy* program. *Legacy* can have an open family file in it while you do this OR you can close the file by following #1 in the next section called "How to download your family from FSFT with Legacy"
- 3. If you have the *FamilySearch* icon, then it is on. If not, click the **Options** tab across the top of *Legacy*.



4. Once looking at the icons in the Options tab, click *Customize*.







- 6. OPTIONAL: If you have an LDS account, also click **1.9 LDS (gbl) Display LDS Information**
- 7. Click Save

How to download your family from FamilySearch Family Tree with Legacy


1. Legacy is not empty if you see names in the family or pedigree views. If you want to make a new file of just what is on FamilySearch, you need to close the existing family file which Legacy is reading. Look for a gray "x" below the Close Program button (usually the close program button is red when you hover over it and it has a white "x" in the upper right corner of your screen). Click down and hold the gray "x" and notice that it turns orange and is identified as a "Close Window" button).




2. When you unclick the **Close Window** "x", *Legacy* turns off the previously opened file (which is already saved where you last used it). Now you have an empty file space in which to import your *FamilySearch* file. If you have a GEDCOM file from another program, here is where you can import it into *Legacy*.



- 3. The program is now indicating which icons are found in the "File" tab. Select the icon **New File**.
- 4. The "What would you like to do?" screen opens. It asks if you want to open one of the Legacy files you have already started. You do not, so go to **Other Choices**:



5. Click on the option **Download my family from FamilySearch**.



6. Now the



Click Next step.

7. Next *Legacy* wants you to **Enter a Name for the New Family File**, and it will try to save it wherever you have other Legacy files. You can direct the window to go to a different file on your computer or to a thumb drive.

Give the file a name such as: **Clifford17Feb2016dwnload_FS**. *Legacy* will add the file extension *.fdb when you finish. Click the **Save** button.




- 8. The *Legacy* program will locate the *FamilySearch* icon so it would appear among the *Legacy* icons.
- 9. Several windows open and other file names will appear such as: System File Edit View... so you will see several icons. If when you customized the Legacy program, you placed the most used icons under the file called My Toolbar, you will find the FamilySearch icon there. A FamilySearch Login window opens and asks for you to Sign in here.



11. If you have entered yourself, it will start with you and go back the number of generations you put in the Options window. I put in 4 generations of ancestors. 1 Descendant generation is enough because only deceased people are shown. Check the box to **Assign source citations to imported data.** Check the option to **Include spouses of children** if you want.


Do not have it check for duplicates the first time as it really slows down the process.




- 12. Give it time to download everyone. It needs to make several swipes over the information. I did 4 generations with all citations and spouses of children and it took 10 minutes with high speed Google Internet. The file contained: **People** 361 **Families** 206. The family number is large because I included spouses for children.
- 13. Legacy asks you permission to "Refresh." Clicking **OK** that it is fine to "Refresh."



14. Now you can see all the people in the program. Since the children for the first person selected were alive they were not included in the Descendant download. When Legacy finished "refreshing" (less than 10 seconds), notice how the sources were imported, the back and forth arrows indicating it matches what is on FSFT, and the red circle with an exclamation point signifying something needs fixing.



Click the **Source icon** to see details brought over from FSFT. This is the **Events icon**. The **Assigned Sources** brought over from *FSFT* as shown on the next page, were all identical except in cases where a researcher put in extra information. They merely indicated the source is available at FamilySearch. Yet the original sources shown in FSFT (and illustrated at the bottom of the next page) contained much more information. FSFT did, however, give a different format of the data for a Footnote or endnote citation, a Subsequent Citation, and a Bibliography. Considering the much better way in which *Legacy* keeps notes, I wouldn't bother downloading source notes at this time.








15. However, the **Events** set the stage to use the **Research Guidance** program in *Legacy* to help you determine what to do next.





Look at an LDS view of the same person. It has back and forth arrows to indicate it matched up with *FSFT*, and letters across the top after the Record ID number of work completed. It also has a red circle with an exclamation point signifying something needs fixing.



16. This is a pedigree view. If you see a red button with a white ! in the middle of it, that is notification that something needs fixing on that person or family. Again the back and forth arrows indicate that it matches what is on FSFT at the time it was downloaded.
